Licence to Fell Growing Trees

PART 2 - Restocking Conditions

This licence is granted subject to the following conditions.

-The following conditions apply to the licenced felling in 3.

1. Before 30th June 2010 the land on which the felling took place must be:
 - a. Cleared of lop and top
 - b. Planted with English oak to achieve not less than 1100 plants per hectare evenly distributed over the site
2. For a period of 10 years from the planting:
 - a. The plants must be protected against damage and be adequately weeded.
 - b. Any failure or losses should be replaced as necessary to provide a stocking of not less than 1100 plants per hectare evenly distributed over the site.
 - c. Any woodland must be maintained in accordance with the rules and practice of good forestry.

-The following conditions apply to the licenced felling in 1 and 2.

1. The land on which the felling took place is to be managed in accordance with the rules and practice of good forestry so as to secure restocking with scots pine, birch, sweet chestnut (cpt 2) to achieve not less than 2100 plants per hectare evenly distributed over the site by natural regeneration, coppice regrowth or replanting.
2. All licenced trees felled are to be removed quickly and carefully so as to avoid damage to the remaining trees or seedlings or coppice shoots.
3. If before 30th June 2010 the restocking described in 1. above is not achieved then the land is to be planted or sown before 30th June 2012 in order to secure a stocking of not less than 2100 trees per hectare of scots pine, sweet chestnut evenly distributed over the site.
4. For a period of 10 years from the restocking:
 - a. The plants must be protected against damage and be adequately weeded.
 - b. Any failure or losses should be replaced as necessary to provide a stocking of not less than 2100 plants per hectare evenly distributed over the site.
 - c. Any woodland must be properly maintained in accordance with the rules and practice of good forestry.
5. When silviculturally desirable retain mature scots pine as individuals and groups throughout cpt 1.

This conditional licence gives you permission under section 10 of the Forestry Act 1967 as amended to fell the trees described below and shown on the attached map.

If you sell the land you should also tell the new owner about this licence. If a Tree Preservation Order is placed on these trees after this licence has been issued, you must also get the consent of the Local Authority before felling the trees.

NOTE In England and Wales, a felling licence will not cover the felling of trees to which a Tree Preservation Order applies, or which are in a Conservation area, if you have not declared the existence of the Order or Area in the application.
